- Being available to answer questions around the clock
- Providing the very best care available in our patients' homes; increasing their ability to stay in their home
- Reducing calls to 911, trips to the emergency room, ICU stays and hospitalizations
- Enhancing communication and education with family allowing greater understanding of the disease and its effects
- Improving medication efficiency through proper management and review

Specialized Person Centered Care

Oklahoma Palliative Care program provides specialized person centered care for seniors with serious illnesses, who are experiencing some or all of the following:

- **Seeking** relief from severe chronic illnesses with symptoms such as pain, shortness of air and anxiety
- **Needing** complex care as the result of multiple diseases requiring difficult and complex decisions to be made
- **Requiring** many medications for disease and symptom control
- **Suffering** from low quality of life for both the patient and the family
- **Receiving** care from multiple health care professionals
- **Experiencing** frequent health care episodes resulting in emergency hospitalizations or additional treatment
- **Seeking** curative treatment but also needing additional assistance



Dedicated Professionals

Oklahoma Palliative Care staff consists of a dedicated team of professionals with specific training to provide comfort and positive outcomes. Our team includes:

- **Medical Directors**, working alongside the patient's primary care physician, provide medical guidance for the team
- **Clinical Directors** oversee the implementation, delivery, coordination and supervision of services provided in the home/facility by the interdisciplinary team
- **RN Case Managers**, in consultation with the patient's physician and program physician, are responsible for coordination and management of symptoms
- **RNs/LPNs** monitor the care, the comfort, and provide education in the home
- **Spiritual Counselors/Chaplains** support the family and patient in their spiritual needs. All services are non-denominational and consistent with the patient's individual beliefs and values
- **Social Workers** assist in identifying community resources and provide counseling and support for the patient and their family



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
